Receipt whereof I do hereby acknowledge, do hereby give, grant, sell
and convey unto the said Moses T. Chapin his Heirs and Assigns, a
certain tract or parcel of land lying in Mendon, with the buildings
standing thereon, containing by estimation ninety two acres be the
same more or less, and is bounded as follows, beginning at the Northeast
corner and runs $W 2^{\circ} S 93$ rods crossing the road to a heap of stones, bounded
North by Andrew Penniman's land, then $N 2^{\circ} W 39\frac{1}{2}$ Rods by said
land to a heap of stones, then $W 40^{\circ} S 49$ rods by land of the Heirs of Jotham
Taft to a heap of stones, then $S 4^{\circ} W 20$ rods by land of the Heirs of Nathan
Wheeler to a white oak stump, then $S 11^{\circ} W 59$ rods by land of the Heirs of
