To all persons to whom these presents shall come, I Nathan-
iel F. Cunningham of Boston in the County of Suffolk
in the State of Massachusetts, Merchant, administrator of the
goods & estate of Adolphus Whitecomb late of said Boston, send
greeting: Whereas, by an order of the Court of Probate begun
and held at Boston within the County of Suffolk on the
fourteenth of October 1839 I the said Cunningham was
licensed and empowered to sell and pass deeds to convey all
the real estate of the said Whitecomb herein after described:
And whereas I the said Cunningham have given public notice
of the intended sale, by printing a notification thereof, three
weeks successively, in the newspapers called the Mercurius
Gazette & the Atlas printed in Concord & Boston agreeably
