Pierce his heirs, executors, administrators or assigns, the sum of three hundred Dollars, by payments of fifty Dollars annually with annual interest on the whole sum till paid, then this deed, as also a certain note bearing date with these presents, given by the said Charles L. Pierce to the said Henry W. Pierce promising to pay the same sum and interest at the time aforesaid, shall all be void, otherwise shall remain in full force.

In witness whereof I the said Charles L. Pierce and Orinda Pierce, wife of the said Charles L. Pierce, in testimony of relinquishing her right to do in the premises have hereunto set our hands and seals this eighth day of November in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and forty nine.
