Rawson dated the 1st day of April 1846, for the sum of five hundred and fifty dollars and interest, which said Moore is to pay, that I have good right to sell and convey the same to the said Henry Moore and that I will warrant and defend the same premises to the said Henry Moore his heirs and assigns forever against the lawful claims and demands of all persons except said Mortgage. And I and wife of the said for the consideration aforesaid do hereby release and quit claim unto the said heirs and assigns, all my right, claim or possibility of Dower, in or out of said premises.
