ed in said Registry of Deeds Book 464 Page 495 & by
Alanson P. Penniman executor of the last will & testa-
ment of Andrew Penniman late of Mendon deceased
dated March 16th A.D. 1837 & recorded in said Registry of Deeds
Book 328 Page 143 to all of which deeds reference is to
be had for a more particular description of the
premises meant to be conveyed hereby, but this con-
veyance is made & received on condition that the
said Philo does & shall support and take care of the
said Moses during his natural life and that said
farm shall remain undivided till after the death
of the said Moses & if said Philo shall fail to support
& take care of the said Moses then this deed shall be
null & void & the property revert back to said Moses
again — To have and to hold the afore granted premises
to the said Philo W. Brown his heirs and assigns to him &
their use and behoof forever And I do for myself my
heirs executors and administrators covenant with the
said Philo W. Brown his heirs and assigns that I am
lawfully seized in fee of the afore granted premises
that they are free of all incumbrances except as aforesaid
that I have good right to sell and convey the same to
the said Philo and that I will and my heirs shall war-
rant and defend the same premises to the said Philo
W. Brown his heirs and assigns forever against the
lawful claims and demands of all persons provided
he complies with the aforesaid conditions — In witness
whereof I the said Moses T. Chapin have here-
unto set my hand and seal this eighteenth day of
January in the year of our Lord one thousand
eight hundred and fifty four —
