Whereas Thomas Gardner, late of Mendon in the County of Worcester and Commonwealth of Massachusetts deceased, by this last will and testament duly proved and allowed at a Probate Court holden at Worcester on the sixteenth day of April A.D. 1872. Am therefore. Know all men by these presents that I John G. Metcalf of said Mendon the Executor named and appointed in said last will and testament, by virtue of the authority aforesaid, and in consideration of ten hundred dollars paid by Ann Sophia Aldrich of said Mendon, the wife of Addison Aldrich the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged, do hereby give grant sell and convey unto the said Ann Sophia Aldrich her heirs and assigns, a certain tract of land, with all the buildings thereon, lying in said Mendon upon the Easterly side of the road leading from Mendon to Blackstone over Southwick Hill and is bounded as follows viz: Beginning at a point upon the Easterly side of said road at the Southwesterly corner of Adam D. Wheelock's land, thence Easterly as the wall now stands to a corner, thence turning and running Southerly as the wall now stands to a corner, thence turning and running Southeasterly as the wall now stands to a corner of land of Galmon G. Wood, the three last lines bounding Northerly and Northeasterly on land of the said A. D. Wheelock, thence turning and running Westerly as the wall now stands to the road aforesaid, bounding Southerly on land of said Galmon G. Wood; thence turning Northerly by and with said road to the place of beginning at the bound first mentioned, containing 10 acres and 105 rods be the same more or less.
