 Pierce & Stevens, a right of way from Courtwell street in Chard-
 ner aforesaid between our house and lane, and over the lane
 or passage way leading to our pasture, to land owned by
 said Pierce & Stevens or John H. Lovewell... To have and to
 hold the granted premises, with all the privileges and appurte-
 nances thereto belonging, to the said Pierce & Stevens and their
 heirs and assigns, to their own use and behoof forever. And
 we do hereby, for ourselves and our heirs, executors and ad-
 ministrators, covenant with the said grantees and their heirs
 and assigns that we are lawfully seized in fee simple of
 the granted premises, that they are free from all incumbran-
 ces, except a mortgage to said Pierce, & a mortgage to G. B.
 Ramsdell, that we have good right to sell and convey the
 same as aforesaid, and that we will, and our heirs, executors
 and administrators shall warrant and defend the same to
 the said grantees, and their heirs and assigns forever against
 the lawful claims and demands of all persons, except the said
