Know all men by these presents that I Charles H. Howe of Mendon in the County of Worcester and Commonwealth of Massachusetts, in consideration of Fifty Dollars and other valuable considerations paid by the Inhabitants of Mendon, in their corporate capacity as the Town of Mendon aforesaid, the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged, do hereby give, grant, bargain, sell and convey unto the said Inhabitants of Mendon in their corporate capacity as aforesaid, a certain tract or parcel of land with a school house thereon owned by grantees, situated in the Easterly part of said Mendon, in what is usually known as the village of South Milford, containing 80 square rods, more or less, and bounded as follows viz: Beginning at corner of a wall on the Easterly side of the road leading from South Milford Post Office to Woonsocket Rhode Island at corner of a wall at other land of grantor; thence Easterly about 123 feet to a stone set in the ground; thence Northeasterly in a line
