Know all men by these presents that I, Eliza A. Munsell, of Norfolk, in the County of Norfolk and Commonwealth of Massachusetts, in consideration of Nine hundred dollars paid by Ann S. Aldrich, of Milford, County of Worcester and Commonwealth of Massachusetts, the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged, do hereby give, grant, bargain, sell and convey unto the said Ann S. Aldrich, a certain tract of land with buildings thereon, situated in Mendon in said County of Worcester, on the Easterly side of the Dam Swamp road, so called, containing 16 acres 405 rods, more or less, and bounded, beginning at a point on the Easterly side of said road, at the Southwesterly corner of J. R. Taft's land, thence Easterly with wall, thence Southerly with wall, thence Southeasterly with wall, to land formerly of Galman G. Wood, the three lines given bounding on said Taft's land, thence Westerly with wall on land formerly of Galman G. Wood to said road, thence with said road to the point of beginning. Also another tract of land with a building thereon, also in said Mendon situated on the Westerly side of said road opposite the tract first named, and bounded: beginning at a point on the Westerly side of said road at a corner of wall at land of Albert N. Darling, thence bounding on said Darling's land with wall and fence to land of Austin A. Taft, thence S. 29<sup>3</sup>/<sub>4</sub>° E. 4 rods 13 links, thence S. 2<sup>1</sup>/<sub>4</sub>° E. 24 rods 18 links, the two last lines bounding on said Austin A. Taft's land, to land formerly of Galman G. Wood, thence on said Galman G. Wood land S. 76° E. about 27 rods to corner of wall at land of Lewis G.
