I also give and bequeath unto my youngest Daughter Betsy Brown, my second best Bed and the furniture belonging to the same, and also the sum of one hundred Dollars, to be paid to her in the following manner, to wit: twenty Dollars in one year after my decease, twenty Dollars in two years after my decease, twenty Dollars in three years after my decease, twenty Dollars in four years after my decease, and twenty Dollars in five years after my decease.

And Lastly, As to all the rest residue and remainder of my Personal Estate Goods & Chattels of what kind and nature soever, I give & bequeath the same, to my youngest Son Moses I. Chapin, whom I hereby appoint sole Executor of this my last Will & Testament, hereby revoking all former Wills by me made.
