Cornstock Stephen. Know all men by these presents, that I Stephen Cornstock, of Smithfield, in the County of Providence and State of Rhode Island, in consideration of two thousand dollars paid to me by Nathaniel A. Inman, of said Smithfield, the receipt whereof I do hereby acknowledge, do hereby grant, sell, and quit claim unto the said Nathaniel A. Inman, his heirs and assigns, all my right, title, claim, and demand, in and unto several tracts or parcels of land, situate on and near "Caleb's Hill", so called, in Mendon, in the County of Worcester, and State of Massachusetts, containing one hundred and six acres, be the sum more or less, with all the buildings, rights, privileges, and appurtenances, to the same in any way belonging. For a description of the premises, reference is had to several deeds of conveyance, as follows, to wit: The deed of Lydia Meinn to Nathaniel Inman and Buffum Inman dated March 30<sup>th</sup> 1824, and recorded in the Registry of Deeds for said County of Worcester, Book 239, Page 538, and the deed of Lohiron Aldrich to said Nathaniel Inman, dated Sept 1, 1830, & recorded in said Registry, Book 292, Page 89, and the deed of Dennis Wheelock to said Nathaniel Inman, dated Sept. 6, 1833 & recorded in said Registry, Book 315, Page 63. The above described tracts of land constituted the farm and real estate of which said Nathaniel Inman died seized in his own right, or in right of his wife, and which said estate was subsequently conveyed by deed of Stephen Cornstock, guardian of Willard A. Inman & Nathaniel A. Inman, minors, to Moses Cooper, dated June 10<sup>th</sup> 1837, and the deed of Rhoda Inman, guardian of Martin Van B. Inman, a minor and by deed of said Rhoda Inman in her own right to said Moses Cooper, and which the said Moses Cooper conveyed to the grantor, by deed dated June 10, 1837, and recorded in said Registry of Deeds, Book 327, Page 468.

To have and to hold the same to the said Nathaniel A. Inman, his heirs and assigns, to his and their use and behoof forever. And I do covenant to warrant and defend said granted and quit claimed premises to the said Nathaniel A. Inman, his heirs and assigns forever, against the lawful claims and demands of all persons, claiming by or under me. In witness whereof, I, the said Stephen Cornstock, & Joanna Cornstock, wife of said Stephen, hereby relinquishing her right of dower in the premises, have hereunto set our hands and seals this twenty fourth day of April, in the year of our Lord, one thousand eight hundred forty eight.
