 and Commonwealth of Massachusetts, for consideration paid, grant to
 Josaphat and Marie Anne Courtemanche, his wife, of Woonsocket, in the
 County of Providence and State of Rhode Island, with W A R R A N T Y
 covenants the old homestead estate of the late Nathaniel A. Inman, called
 the Hill Farm, and situated in the southerly part of said MENDON, and
 Courtemanche et ux. which farm is bounded and described as follows: Beginning at the extreme
 southwest corner at a stake and stones on the east side of the old "dam
