In the Name of God Amen, the 15th Month Day of August 1746
 I James Keyes of Boston in the County of Worcester & Province of Massachusetts
 Bay in New-England Yeoman being very sick and weak in Body but of perfect
 mind & memory thanksgiving unto God therefor calling unto mind of my
 mind & memory that it is appointed for all men once to die Do make and Ordain
 by my last will & Testament that it is to say principally and first of all I Give &
 Recommend my soul into the hands of God & Give up my Body to be Buried
 to the Earth to be buried in Decent Christian Burial at the Direction of
 my Executor nothing Doubting but at the General Resurrection I shall Revive
 of same again by the my help power of Gods and at Touching such Worldly Estate
 whereunto it shall please God to Bless me in this Life (after my just Debt & funeral
 Charges are paid I Give Demise & Dispose of the same in the following manner I Give
 Impower Give and Bequeath unto my Three Daughters Elizabeth Keyes Hannah
 Marble & Patience Keyes now Living with me in Improvement of all my home
 place & East End of my house Dwelling here Single state in Life & Each of them to
 be maintained Every year my Ores & meadows to be divided between Joseph Marble & my
 three Daughters before mentioned & all my moveables to be Equally Divided
 between said Three Daughters Except my surviving Instruments & when they or either
 of you shall marry or be Taken away by Death then if part of the said Land & house to
 Return to my Grandson Joseph Marble as his own property for ever & my will is
 that Joseph Marble & my Three Daughters should live together as here to the
 Item I Give unto my Son William Keyes all my surviving Instruments
 I also Impower him to sell a piece of Land Lying near to Spectacle meadow
 containing near an Hundred & Ten acres and to distribute the money Equally
 between all my Children vizt Elias Keyes James Keyes Mathias Keyes William
 Keyes Elizabeth Keyes Hannah Marble Sarah Brooks & Children of
 Prudence Wilder & Patience Keyes Item I Give unto my Son Joseph
 Marble a piece of Land lying on Dullocks Hill containing about Twelve
 acres also all my Husbandry Wood & (after the Death of my three Daughters
 vizt Elizabeth Hannah & Patience at my home place
 Harfeing & Land & meadow to his & if hee shall die my Son

I Likewise Constitute make and Ordain my son William Keyes to be my sole & executor
 of this my last will & Testament & do allow & allowe & I shall allow all & Every
 other former Testament will Legacies & Bequests of & Executors by me in any way
 before named Willed & Bequeathed & Confirming this & no other to be of my
 last will & Testament In Witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand & seal the
 Day & year above written of the said to be maintained Every year where Interlined before
