I give and bequeath unto my fine daughter, Mr. Hannah Stoff Pease Pease, Rhoda Nelson; all the remainder of my Estate not heretofore given away (if there be any left after my debts and funeral charges are paid) to be equally divided among them. And I hereby make and ordain my beloved son Seth Whelock of Mendon Gent my only and sole executor of this my last will and Testament forever hereafter, revoking and disallowing all and every other former Wills, Testaments, Legacies or bequests, by me in any wise named, willed or bequeathed forever hereafter ratifying & confirming this and none other to be my last will & Testament.
