In the Name of God Amen, I Hannah Wheelock of Andover in the County of Worcester. Commonwealth of Massachusetts Spinster; being advanced in life but of a sound mind and memory thanks be given to God therefore calling to mind the mortality of my body and knowing that it is appointed unto man Once to die do make and ordain this as my last Will and Testament, that is to say principally and first full I give and bequeath my soul unto the hands of God who gave it to my Father through the merits Death and passion of my Saviour Jesus Christ I shall receive a full and free pardon of all my sins and inherit eternal life - and my body I commit to the earth to be buried in a Christian like and decent manner at the discretion of my executor hereafter named; nothing doubting but at the general resurrection I shall receive the same again by the mighty power of God. And as touching such worldly Estate as it hath pleased God to bless me with in this life and unto, I give bequeath and dispose of in the manner and form following, viz. Item I give and bequeath to my son Caleb Wheelock my old fire shoe & tongs -

I am I give and bequeath to my son Calvin Wheelock the hand bellows and old Quilt Bed and the large Iron pot

I am I give and bequeath unto my son Luther Wheelock four sheep
