commit to the Earth to be buried in a Christian like and decent manner at the
discretion of my executor hereafter named, nothing obstructing but at the general
resurrection I shall receive the same again by the mighty power of God. And as
touching such worldly Estate as it hath pleased God to help me with in this life and
