

to Reuben Motcott, then bounding Southeasterly on land belonging to said Motcott, Thomas Low and Simon Staples till it comes to the great road leading from Worcester to Providence then bounding easterly on said road till it comes to land belonging to Dan Aldrich, then turning and running Westerly and bounding Northerly on land belonging to the Widow & heirs of Colonel Phillip Andison late of Mendon aforesaid deceased - then turning & running Northerly to the Hartford road, and bounding easterly on land belonging to the Widow and heirs of said Phillip Andison deceased, then turning and running Westerly to land belonging to said George Aldrich, and bounding North only on said Hartford road, the said tract of land being part of the real estate of which George Heath late of Mendon aforesaid died seized - I do also by these presents release relinquish and quit claim unto the said John Hill his heirs and assigns forever, all my right little interest claim estate or demand in and unto a few situated in the First Parish Meeting house in said Mendon of which the said George Heath died seized and possessed and I do also by these presents, renounce, release, relinquish give up, and quit claim unto the said John Hill his heirs and assigns forever, all right, little claim interest estate or demand, of, in & unto all manner of estate of which the said George Heath died seized and possessed to which I might heretofore have had any claim right or title under or in virtue of the last will and testament of the said George Heath deceased.

To have and to hold the aforesaid mentioned premises, with all the privileges and appurtenances therunto belonging, to him the said John Hill his heirs and assigns forever; so that neither I the said Benjamin Whelock nor my heirs, or any other persons or persons claiming from or under me or them, or in the name right or stead of me or them, shall or will by any way or means, have, claim, or demand any right or title to the aforesaid premises, or their appurtenance, or to any part or parcel thereof, for ever.
