

Lancaster, containing four acres, one hundred and forty-three rods, more or less, described as follows to wit - Beginning at a stake & stones, at the north-east corner by the boundary Road leading to Worcester, thence running S. 12° 30' W. sixteen rods, to a stake & stones, thence S. 85° W. thirty-six rods and five links, to a stake & stones, thence N. 18° 30' W., to a stake & stones, by said road, thence easterly, by said road, forty-seven rods to the first mentioned bound. Excepting and reserving therefrom, forty rods of land conveyed by me to the Inhabitants of the Town of Lancaster, by deed, dated December 7th 1855. The premises being the same conveyed to me by Nathaniel Thayer & Joseph Willard, Executors of the last will & testament of Sam'l Ward, by deed, dated December 1st 1824, with the exception above stated. Reference to both said deeds being had, for a more particular description of the premises. To have and to hold the above-granted premises, with the privileges and appurtenances thereto belonging, to the said George W. Parker, his heirs and assigns, to his & their use and behoof forever. And I the said Austin Davis for myself and my heirs, executors and administrators, do covenant with the said George W. Parker, his heirs and assigns, that I am lawfully seized in fee of the above-granted premises, that they are free from all incumbrances; that I have a good right to sell and convey the same to the said George W. Parker, his heirs and assigns forever, as aforesaid, and that I will and my heirs, executors and administrators, shall warrant and defend the same to the said George W. Parker, his heirs and assigns forever, against the lawful claims and demands of all persons.

In witness whereof, we the said Austin Davis and Sally, wife of said Austin, in token of her release of all right and title of or to both dinner and homestead, in the granted premises, have hereunto set our hands and seals, the twelfth day of February, in the year of our Lord eighteen hundred and sixty-four.
