

will and my heirs shall warrant and defend the same premises to the said Charles Chandler his heirs and assigns forever against the lawful claims and demands of all persons.

Provided nevertheless, that if the said James Burns his heirs, executors, or administrators, fail to the said Charles Chandler his heirs, executors, administrators or assigns the sum of seven hundred dollars in yearly payments of fifty dollars each with interest annually, the first of said payments to be made on the 2<sup>d</sup> day of October A.D. 1883, then this deed as also a certain note bearing date with these presents, given by the said James Burns to the said Charles Chandler to pay the same sum & interest at the time aforesaid, shall be void; otherwise shall remain in full force. And provided also that the mortagor, his heirs and assigns may remain in possession of said premises till condition broken.

In witness whereof, the said James Burns have hereunto set my hand and seal this second day of October in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and seventy nine.

Gaywood: Westerly on land now or formerly of
