

Nidow also the Wood yard bounded as follows beginning at a Stake and stones the West side of the road by the Hog yard; thence S. 75 deg. W. 2 $\frac{1}{2}$ rods to Stake and stones; thence N. 11 $\frac{1}{2}$ deg. W. 3 $\frac{1}{2}$ rods to the South door of said House; thence S. 10 deg. E. 2 $\frac{1}{2}$ rods to said road; thence by said road to the first mentioned bounds. Likewise giving them a privilege to keep & repair to the Water. We also set to Celia & Sumner Ballou, the Barn lot, so called; and that part of the Barn and Barn yard that was excluded from the Nidow Dower. Said lot bounded as follows beginning at the Northwest corner of said lot at the fork of the roads; thence Eastward about severally five rods to Alexander Prayors land, bounded Northwardly by said roads; thence South about twenty two degrees West forty nine and an half rods to the Providence road, bounded Southwardly on said Prayors lands; thence Northwardly by said road about 4 $\frac{1}{2}$ rods to the first mentioned bounds containing Eleven & one half Acres. W. 5 $\frac{1}{2}$ rods to Stake and stones bounded Westwardly by our said Nidow Dower; thence S. 35 $\frac{1}{2}$ E. 15 $\frac{1}{2}$ rods to a heap of stones on a large stump, being the Northwest corner of Alexander Prayors Woodland bounded Westwardly on land this day set to Linni Cook; thence S. 13 $\frac{1}{2}$ E. 39 rods to Stake and stones; thence N. 70 $\frac{1}{2}$ E. 55 $\frac{1}{2}$ rods to the Southwest corner of Stephen Cooks Pasture, the two last lines bounding Westwardly and Southwardly on said Prayors land; thence S. 13 $\frac{1}{2}$ W. 56 rods to the first mentioned bounds, bounding Easterly on said Cooks land containing Fifteen Acres and one hundred rods.
